


NATIONAL GROWER NETWORK (NGN) 2024




Some areas to focus on and the plan moving forward:

- •The program is fit for purpose, responding to local issues effectively and efficiently, with some variation in impact of individual projects
- •There are opportunities to use targeted evaluation tools to help maintain and improve program performance (M&E)

Continue expanding NGN's reach by:

- Face to face forums to continue (key speakers/locally relevant research)
- •Surveys, young grower diaries, text messages etc. to capture feedback from non-attendees 'Utilising tech'
- Collaborating with grower/adviser groups, as well as young grower/adviser and women's networks





Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E)

- A Nationally consistent method to monitor project performance
- This may replace some of the detailed written reporting
- What measures are there to assess increased grower awareness in the continuation of the adoption process?
- How do we capture this data without more surveys?
