





- Not shown is +\$12m projects completed during collaboration term [\$80m all time portfolio]






## Project earnings

\*Revenue spread over life of active projects [currently 2021-2028]








## GGA vs group earnings


- \$9.2m earning for partner grower groups is more than double GGA's



## Future DPIRD-GGA Collaboration

- Current six-year agreement expires May 2025
- Independent 'return to state' business case for Extension currently under evaluation
- GGA has had to invest \$25,000 to fund half the \$50,000 business case cost.
- GGA is advocating that member groups provide a unique value proposition to the state with Extension and Adoption. This was not funded/resourced in the first collaboration.









## GGA and groups agility valued

- GGA's agility and connectivity with groups is unique and valued in the industry ecosystem
- Our ability for rapid mobilisation was recruited for the Dry Season Outreach Response project
- GGA assessed 26 grant applications administering and mobilising support for 21 initiatives in a 4-week period
- GGA and member groups ability to collaboration to achieve rapid cut-through is unmatched and our combined value proposition.
